WT Services awarding scholarships this spring to Hereford, Friona, Bovina, Bushland graduates

WT Services is now accepting applications for scholarships that will be awarded students in Hereford, Friona, Bovina, and Bushland in May, 2014.

Scholarships are open only to students whose parents or guardians are WT Services customers, or, to students who are WT Services customers themselves. Applicants must be high school seniors who are candidates for graduation this spring.

An official application form, accompanied by two letters of recommendation, and a wallet-size photo must be submitted. One

of the letters of recommendation must be from a teacher, principal, or counselor from the high school that the applicant is currently attending.

In Hereford, applications may be picked up at the WT Services office at 119 East 4th, or at the Hereford High School counselor's office.

Applications and rules may be picked up at the WT Services office in Friona at 1010 Columbia, and will be provided to the counselor's offices at Friona, Bovina, and Bushland high schools.

To be considered, applications must be fully completed, legibly typed or written, have no at-

tachments other than the photo and two required letters of recommendation. (See **SCHOLARSHIPS**, Page 2)

Payment by bank draft nets 1 percent discount

WT Services customers in Hereford can take advantage of a one percent discount by paying their bill by bank draft.

Customers who authorize this form of payment agree to have their bank account drafted for the amount of their outstanding balance on their account with WT Services. Drafts will occur between the 20th and 23rd of each month.

Cable programming rate hike reflected in this month's bill

Cable television customers of WT Services will notice an increased charge for their cable TV services in this month's bill. Virtually all programs seen on your TV are provided to Cable TV companies such as WT Services for a monthly fee. These programmers (ESPN, Lifetime, etc) annually increase this re-broadcast fee to WT Services which then passes it on to our customers. This does not increase profit made by WT Services, but rather it is solely passed on to the TV programmers to continue carrying their quality broadcasts. On an on-going basis, WT Services negotiates the best programming rates it can to minimize this annual increase to our customers and appreciates your understanding, and continued patronage.

tion, and must be received at the offices of WT Services, Inc. P.O. Box 1776, Hereford, Texas 79045, no later than April 8, 2014.

Mechanics of the scholarships include the following:

* WT SERVICES scholarships may be used at any state or church-sponsored college or university, or at any accredited vocational or technical school.

* Recipients must maintain a minimum of twelve credited hours throughout each semester, or have full-time student status at vocational or trade schools.

* Upon enrollment or pre-enrollment for the fall semester, recipients must send WT SERVICES a confirmation from the registrar's office. Should a recipient drop out of school for any reason, the unused portion of the scholarship will be rescinded.

TTAF Scholarships available this year

The Texas Telephone Association Foundation has announced it will award six Texas students four-year college scholarships in the amount of \$1,500 per year to students entering college for the 2014-2015 school year.

The TTAF Scholarship Committee will review applications and give special consideration to students pursuing a college degree in fields of interest in communications such as math, business, education, technology, engineering, and computer science. Completed scholarship applications must be postmarked no later than March 28, 2014.

Any student applying for the scholarship must be a U.S. citizen, graduating from a Texas high school no later than June, 2014, have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher, and planning to begin college by the fall of 2014.
