Maddison Watts, daughter of Bryan and Cori Watts of Hereford and a May graduate of Hereford High School is the recipient of a \$500 academic scholarship from WT Services for 2015.

Miss Watts plans to attend West Texas A&M University where she will major in Nursing.

WT Services launched a scholarship program in 2014, following the lead of its parent company, West Texas Rural Telephone Cooperative, that has been presenting scholarships

since 1997. WT Services offers scholarships to graduating seniors from Hereford, Friona, Bovina, and Bushland high schools whose parents or guardians are WT Services customers, or to students who are WT Services customers themselves.

With three scholarships awarded this spring WT Services has now awarded \$3,500 in grants to seven students in its young scholarship program.

Cooperating workers outfit GE Power with radio gear

A cooperative effort between WT Services radio shop and WTRT Construction personnel recently resulted in the installation of some top-notch communications equipment and a safer working environment for employees of GE Power at the new wind turbine farm southeast of Hereford.

Turbines at the site became operational earlier this year and have become a familiar sight adjacent to Highway 385 southeast of Hereford.

Doug Baker of WT Services Radio Systems sales closed the deal on the transaction that involved a modern Motorola Turbo two-way radio system that included a repeater and hand-held radios.

"Cell phone coverage is poor in the vicinity where the wind turbines are located in the Jumbo area southeast of Hereford.

"GE Power needed reliable communications capability for emergencies and day to day operations and this radio system fit the bill, including allowing maintenance and repair workers to communicate

from the top and bottom of the turbines," Baker explained.

Matt Davis of the Radio Division's installation and repair team came over from Amarillo to install repeater equipment inside a building at the Jumbo site.

Javier Bravo and David Fulfer of the WTRT Construction Team were on hand with a bucket truck to perform outside duties including completing the installation of an antenna for the radio system on the roof of a metal building at the site.

Baker says this sale of

radio equipment at a wind energy site could open up other possibilities as additional wind energy installations are anticipated in the area east and to the far west of Hereford in the future.
